

# T.E.A.M. 21 After-School & Summer Program

## Community Benefit Report 2013-14

### LITERACY GAINS:

T.E.A.M. 21 is rated in the **top 15%** of **280** comparable after-school programs statewide in literacy improvement.



### MAKING AN IMPACT:

**89%** of participants in T.E.A.M. 21 are classified as academically at-risk by the Michigan Department of Education.



### QUALITY STAFFING:

T.E.A.M. 21 maintains a staff-to-student ratio of at least **1** staff member for **every 12** participants, allowing for more individualized instruction.



### ENGAGING STUDENTS:

Daily attendance rates place T.E.A.M. 21 in the **top 15%** of programs in the state, averaging **43** students per site in the school year, and **80** students per site in the summer.



### PROGRAM DEMAND:

**1,071** students attended T.E.A.M. 21 during the 2013-14 year (including summer 2013), across our 7 program sites.

More than **90%** of parents of T.E.A.M. 21 students report that the program helped their child with school performance.






## COMMUNITY SUPPORT:

During the 2013-14 year, volunteers logged over **1,400 hours** assisting in countless ways in T.E.A.M. 21, and community members and organizations donated **\$23,125** of in-kind materials and services to the program.

While direct costs for the operation of T.E.A.M. 21 are funded through the 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) grants, the partnering agencies that comprise T.E.A.M. 21, the City of Wyoming and the four public school districts – Wyoming, Godfrey-Lee, Godwin Heights and Kelloggsville, provide significant in-kind contributions to support the overall operation of the program.
