

# Kent County Veterans Treatment Court



***Nullum In Iure Post Veteran—“Leave No Veteran Behind”***

The Kent County Veterans Treatment Court (KCVTC) program is only for veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States as defined in MCL 600.1200 (h). The Kent County Veterans Treatment Court (KCVTC) is a court-supervised program coupled with intensive treatment and supervision for non-violent criminal offenders as defined in MCL 600.1201 (a-j). It is designed to address those who are committing criminal offenses related to injuries that were incurred through military service, as well as those committed through a failure to adequately address issues attendant to military service.

Participation in The Kent County Veterans Treatment Court (KCVTC) is voluntary. The Michigan State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) considers all Veteran Treatment Courts as problem solving, specialty courts. Veteran Treatment Courts are “hybrid” courts that address a veterans’ mental health and/or substance abuse problems, within the context of the criminal justice system (see paragraph above). The Kent County Veterans Treatment Court (KCVTC) which, is based at the 62-A district court in Wyoming, is available only for those veterans who are residents of Kent County.
