- 2. The City is relying upon, and the Company agrees the City may rely upon, the representations in the preceding paragraph, in the Application, and at the public hearing, for purposes of determining the length of the Abatement, the amount of the Abatement, and other terms of the Abatement.

    - (2) The City Council, in its sole discretion, may require the Company to pay the City all or any part of an amount equal to the total taxes abated by the City under the Tax Abatement.

### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the City Council authorize payment to AT&T for their fully managed Internet Service (MIS). The City Council authorized the renewal of a master agreement with AT&T for high speed digital circuits to connect the different facilities throughout the City to allow City of Wyoming computers to be networked in May, 2011. In June, 2012 we upgraded our AT&T communications contract to take advantage of newer technology and to prepare for the implementation of VoIP by replacing our DS3/T1 and TDS phone lines with PRI Trunks and the Opt-E-Man circuits. In November, 2012 we contracted with AT&T for the remaining telephone lines and/or circuits not covered with the City's VoIP contract. This AT&T agreement will allow the City to increase the City's bandwidth from 4.5MB copper service to a 50MB fiber-based, fully managed router service.

### Sustainability Criteria:

Environmental Quality - Approval of this bid does not significantly impact environmental quality.

Social Equity - Information Technology staff have been updating the City's infrastructure in order to improve and/or allow City users the ability to work more effectively.

Economic Strength - Contracting with this service provider is also consistent with our goal of maintaining our IT infrastructure to support technology solutions, facilitate interoperability and connectivity, and support technologies/processes that increase service to our employees and/or citizens.

### Discussion:

Information Technology staff requested upgrade pricing from ISERV, our current Internet provider, and was advised the cost for a dedicated 10MB fiber would be \$1,575. Pricing for a 50MB fiber from Comcast was \$1,498 and from Trivalent at over \$2,000 per month. AT&T advised they would provide MIS w/Managed Router for 50MB fiber at the price indicated for 30MB fiber (see Table 23: Flexible Bandwidth Billing Option-Ethernet, 92% discount) which is \$418.40 per month. The charge for Local Access is \$880 per month (see the last page of the AT&T agreement) for a total cost of \$1,298.40. The fully managed router service will provide for advance notice of outages and/or AT&T will automatically work on outages instead of us having to call-in outages like we do today.

Three original master agreements (AT&T Managed Internet Service Pricing Schedule) have been signed by AT&T and are provided.

### Budget Impact:

Funding for the 50MB fiber-based, fully managed router service is budgeted and available in the General Fund/Information Technology/Communications account #101-258-25800-850000.

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### Recommendation:

Staff recommends repeal of Ordinance Sections 14-231 through 14-246, Amusement Machines, as obsolete.

### Sustainability Criteria:

Environmental Quality – No impact.

Social Equity – The regulation of amusement machines was once considered necessary by the City of Wyoming to prevent illegal gambling, to regulate and control the size and location of amusement machines, regulate the concentration of amusement machines at any one location, and protect the public welfare and peace. The way amusement machines are designed, marketed and used no longer represent a significant risk to the public welfare and peace.

Economic Strength – Revenue from amusement machine license fees has averaged about \$,1500 per year over the past three years. Individual companies have paid license fees ranging from \$50 to nearly \$300 per year. These fees would not be replaced.

### Discussion:

The City of Wyoming no longer identifies significant risk to public health, safety and welfare from the ownership and operation of amusement machines which would warrant specific machine regulations.

Any amusement machines or use of amusement machines that constitutes gambling under state law would still be prohibited under state law. Repeal of this ordinance would not legalize any amusement machines currently not legal; it would allow the value of noncash prizes for ticket redemption games to rise from \$150 (the current ordinance) to \$500 (state law).

Budget Impact: Business license fee revenue would be reduced by approximately \$1,500 per year.
